

AN OVERTURE

The European Union Youth Orchestra is one of the world's most prestigious and dynamic orchestras. It unites Europe's most talented young musicians from all 27 EU countries, under some of the world's most famous conductors, in an orchestra that transcends cultural boundaries and performs all over the world.

The musical ability and

commitment demanded of the players, combined with the renowned musical leadership of its conductors, has won the EUYO an outstanding musical and educational reputation and regular comparisons with the world's finest orchestras.

The EUYO was founded in 1978 by Lionel and Joy Bryer, founding Chairman and Secretary General of the International Youth Foundation of Great Britain, with a view to creating an orchestra that would represent the European ideal of a community working together to achieve peace, social and cultural understanding.

The proposal for the creation of the Orchestra was put to the Committee on Cultural Affairs and Youth of the European Parliament in 1974. As a result of an all-party effort, a resolution was adopted by the European Parliament with an overwhelming majority on 8 March 1976 and the European Commission officially confirmed the patronage of the Orchestra in April 1976. Claudio Abbado, the Orchestra's

Founding Music Director, and its first President, the Rt Hon Sir Edward Heath, KG, MBE, helped to establish the EUYO as a world-class institution. Claudio Abbado was succeeded as Music Director by Bernard Haitink, KBE, who in turn was succeeded by the EUYO's present Music Director, Vladimir Ashkenazy.

In addition to the EUYO's Music Directors, world famous guest conductors have included Daniel Barenboim, Leonard Bernstein, James Conlon, Sir Colin Davis, Carlo Maria Giulini, Herbert von Karajan, Mstislav Rostropovich, Sir Georg Solti, KBE, and Sir John Eliot Gardiner. Notable soloists who have worked with the EUYO include Emanuel Ax, Teresa Berganza, Kyung-Wha Chung, Barbara Hendricks, Nigel Kennedy, Radu Lupu, Lord Yehudi Menuhin, Anne-Sophie Mutter, Jessye Norman, Murray Perahia and Ravi Shankar.

The Orchestra comprises up to 140 players, representing all 27 member countries of the European Union. The players are selected each year from over 4,000 candidates aged



between 14 and 24, who take part in auditions throughout the EU. The competition is such that current members of the Orchestra have to re-audition along with new applicants each year in order to keep their places. Once the members have been selected for the year, they are invited to join the EUYO for intensive residential rehearsal periods, followed by demanding tours, offering them the opportunity to perform on international stages all over the world.

The EUYO provides an invaluable professional development experience for young orchestral musicians. It is a unique advanced training opportunity for musicians to bridge the gap between music colleges and the cosmopolitan professional music world. Over 90% of EUYO players go on to become professional musicians, and many have found jobs with Europe's leading orchestras.

Since its inaugural tour, the Orchestra has gone from strength to strength and continues to attract incredibly gifted players and world class conductors, performing to full houses in all the major cities, concert halls, and festivals of Europe, as well as undertaking important foreign tours to destinations which have included China, Hong Kong, Japan, India, North and South America, Russia and the Baltic States. In 2007 the EUYO performed by invitation from the Federal Chancellery at the official session of the Heads of State at their informal Summit in Berlin and undertook a tour that culminated in two performances in Kazakhstan. This spring, the Orchestra was invited to perform at the European Parliament in Strasbourg as part of its 50th Anniversary Celebrations, before touring round Europe, including gala performances in new EU member states, Bulgaria and Romania, for the first time.

In recognition of the Orchestra's achievements, prizes awarded to the EUYO include the Olympia Prize of the Alexander S Onassis Public Benefit Foundation, the 'Prix d'Initiative Européenne', the Grant for Young Artists awarded by The Praemium Imperiale and the 'European Media Prize'.

Vasily Petrenko

GUEST CONDUCTOR

Born in 1976 Vasily Petrenko started his music education at the St Petersburg Capella Boys Music School – the oldest music school in Russia. He then studied at the St Petersburg Conservatoire and has also participated in masterclasses with such major figures as Ilya Musin, Mariss Jansons, Yuri Temirkanov and Esa-Pekka Salonen. He was Chief Conductor of the State Academy Orchestra of St Petersburg from 2004 to 2007. He commenced his position as Principal Conductor of the Royal Liverpool Philharmonic Orchestra in September 2006 and six months into his first season this contract was extended till 2012.

During the last few years, Petrenko has had considerable success in a number of international conducting competitions including the Fourth Prokofiev Conducting Competition in St Petersburg (2003), First Prize in the Shostakovich Choral Conducting Competition in St Petersburg (1997) and First Prize in the Sixth Cadaques International Conducting Competition in Spain.

Between 1994 and 1997, Petrenko was Resident Conductor at the St Petersburg State Opera and Ballet Theatre in the Mussorgsky Memorial Theatre. During this time he gained an enormous amount of operatic experience and he now has over 30 operas in his repertoire. In March 2004 he made a highly successful debut at the Hamburg State Opera conducting Tchaikovsky's *Pique Dame*. During recent seasons Petrenko has conducted many key orchestras in Russia including the St Petersburg Philharmonic and the Moscow Philharmonic.

Petrenko is equally at home in symphonic and operatic repertoire. This season, made his debut with the London Symphony Orchestra, returned to the Barbican in April to conduct the National Youth Orchestra of Great Britain, and also returns to the Rotterdam Philharmonic. In August, he makes his BBC Proms debut with the Royal Liverpool Philharmonic, and tours with the European Union Youth

Orchestra, and highlights of the 2008/09 season and beyond include his debuts with the Netherlands Radio Philharmonic, Leipzig Gewandhaus, Iceland Symphony and Budapest Festival Orchestras. After making a highly successful US debut last season, Petrenko has been invited to Dallas, Baltimore, Cincinnati, Milwaukee and St Louis Symphony Orchestras for 2008/09, and the Atlanta Symphony and National Symphony Orchestra Washington for 2009/10.

Operatically, he has conducted three productions in recent seasons at the Netherlands Reisopera (Puccini's *Le Villi* and *Messa da Gloria, I due Foscari* and *Boris Godounov*) and future plans include his debuts at Glyndebourne Festival Opera, and the Opera de Paris (Bastille).

Recordings with the Royal Liverpool Philharmonic Orchestra include a rare double bill of Fleishman's *Rothschild's Violin* and Shostakovich's *The Gamblers*, and a disc of suites from Tchaikovsky's ballets. Due for release shortly is his debut recording for Naxos (Tchaikovsky's *Manfred Symphony*), and in summer 2008 he records with Naxos his first disc in a Shostakovich symphony project. In October 2007 Vasily Petrenko was named Young Artist of the Year at the annual Gramophone Awards.

EUYO MUSIC DIRECTOR


In the years since Vladimir Ashkenazy first came to prominence on the world stage in the 1955 Chopin Competition in Warsaw he has built an extraordinary career, not only as one of the most renowned and revered

career, not only as one of the most renowned and revered pianists of our times, but as an artist whose creative life encompasses a vast range of activities and continues to offer inspiration to music-lovers across the world.

Conducting has formed the largest part of his activities for the past 20 years and, following on from his period as Chief Conductor of the Czech Philharmonic from 1998 to 2003, Ashkenazy took up the position of Music Director of NHK Symphony Orchestra in Tokyo in September 2004. In Autumn 2005 he completed his second highly successful European tour with them, including a televised concert at the Vienna Musikverein which marked the orchestra's debut in this prestigious venue.

Alongside his position with the NHK Symphony
Orchestra, Ashkenazy is, of course, the EUYO's Music Director and regularly conducts the Orchestra on world-wide tours including most recently those all over Europe, to South America and Kazakhstan. Ashkenazy continues to have a warm and rewarding relationship with the Philharmonia and Iceland Symphony Orchestras as their Conductor Laureate. He also maintains strong links with a number of other major orchestras including the Cleveland Orchestra (former Principal Guest Conductor), and Deutsches Symphonie Orchester Berlin (Chief Conductor and Music Director 1988-96), as well as making guest appearances with many other orchestras all around the world.

While conducting takes up a significant portion of his time each season, Ashkenazy continues to devote himself to the piano, directing Mozart and Beethoven concertos from the keyboard in performances in Europe and Asia, and continuing to build his extraordinarily comprehensive recording



catalogue with releases such as the 1999 Grammy award-winning Shostakovich *Preludes and Fugues*, Rautavaara's *Piano Concerto No.3* (a work which he commissioned) and Rachmaninov Transcriptions. Most recently released is his recording of Bach's *Wohltemperierte Klavier*.

Beyond his hectic and fulfilling performing schedule,
Ashkenazy continues to be involved in some fascinating TV
projects, often inspired by his passionate drive to ensure that
serious music continues to have a platform in the
mainstream media and is made available to as broad an
audience as possible. This includes developing educational
programmes such as Superteachers working with inner-city
London school children, and a documentary based around
his 'Prokofiev and Shostakovich Under Stalin' project.





EUYO IN BOLZANO

'Compared to other cities of Europe, it is fairly hard for a city like ours to play an important role in international cultural life. And a lot has changed since 1982, the year when the European Union Youth Orchestra came to Bolzano for the first time. Cultural events have become very important indeed and every year major European cities compete to be crowned "European City of Culture" for one year. Over time, the members of the orchestra have all kept their own unique memories of their time in this city, and they are sharing these experiences with other people. Thus our city has contributed to further the friendship and peaceful co-existence of the nations, and the language of music has created an ideal ground for their mutual understanding."




EUYO IN KOREA

Acclaimed by audiences, critics and fellow musicians, Dong-Hyek Lim has quickly come to be regarded as one of the finest pianists of his generation. He was born in 1984 in Seoul, South Korea, and after early studies at the National Conservatoire in his native country, he moved to Russia at age ten to become a pupil at the

Moscow Central Music School. He graduated in 1998 and continued studies at the Moscow State Tchaikovsky Conservatoire with Professor Lev Naumov and recently moved to the States to study with Emanuel Ax at the



Juilliard School. His performances at the Small and Great Halls of the Moscow State Conservatoire, Salle Pleyel in Paris, the Lazienski Palace in Warsaw, the Konzerthaus in Berlin and with Martha Argerich at the Philharmonic Hall in Beppu, Japan, have met with great acclaim.

In May 2001, Lim became the youngest pianist ever to sign a recording contract with EMI Classics and received the Diapason d'Or award in France for his debut album of Chopin, Schubert, and Ravel under the "Martha Argerich Presents" series, released in June 2002. His second recording for EMI, released in 2004, was awarded the Choc Prize by Le Monde de la Musique. Lim has received top awards at various competitions. In December 2001, not only did he become the youngest winner of the Premier Grand Prix in the history of the Marguerite Long-Jacques Thibaud International Piano Competition in Paris, but also he won five other special awards.
